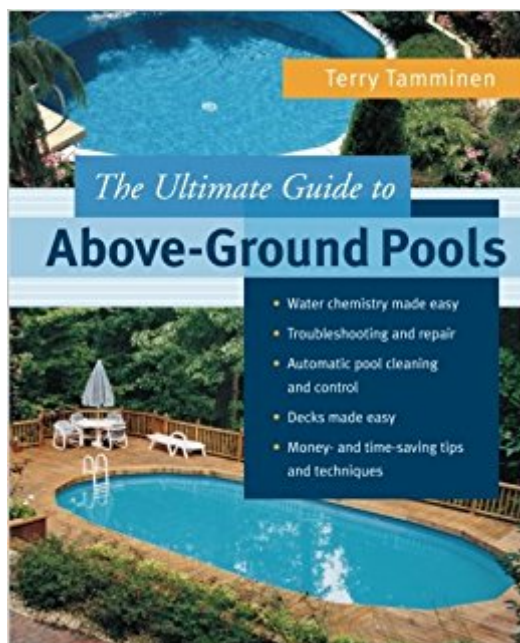

This book is exactly what its title claims it to be. It is everything you need to know about building and maintaining an above-ground pool. I "inherited" an old pool when buying an old house, and had no experience with pools before. With this book I was able to install a new filter, a new liner, and assess the viability for solar heat for my location. It also offers the basics of daily maintenance and startup and close-down for the seasons. Everything you could ever need to know is here, is easy to find, and logically and clearly presented. Even the total novice can make good use of this guide. Terry Tamminen is a real hero to this single mom who wanted to figure out how to offer the fun of an

above ground pool for a seven-year-old boy--now ten, and fully enjoying the summer fun of the pool!

I own all of Tamminen's excellent books on pools, spas, and hot tubs. I am not a pool professional, but I do like to build and install and maintain. Knowing how to fix and build things saves money, and this book in particular has made me the go-to guy in the neighborhood. This book has never let me down with any question I had. I recommend it to anyone with an above-ground pool (or someone with a lot of neighbors with them).

I had an ordinary fiberglass pool for years and decided to build one using a vinyl liner in a deep navy blue. Our pool has a glass wall around and it's just gorgeous. So now with this book, we can see the care that goes into our pool is quite different than the concrete or fiberglass ones. The writer makes sure to use easy terminology and makes his directions as clear as the water you will get with this book. Great info.

So its not that this manual is bad... it's just not what is expected. I was looking for a 'pool guide for dummies' - you know plain/simple instructions/FAQs/Diagrams etc. This is an extremely detailed book that just describes (in LOTS of detail) the components of an above ground pool and how to initially set one up. If you are looking to buy a pool and just want a bunch of facts, this is the book for you. If you bought a house that already has a pool and you need to know what to do - save yourself the \$\$ and just Google/Bing your questions and for pictures of set up because this book is useless.

My boyfriend bought a house with an above ground pool, which is great...until you realize you have no idea how to maintain it, let alone troubleshoot problems. He finds this book to be incredibly helpful. He was particularly pleased to see the very detailed diagrams of how the pump and filter are supposed to be set up, since he suspected his was not set up correctly by the previous owners - and he was correct. The book covers all the basic maintenance topics, as well as the setup of a whole new system, if needed.

Would be good information for a beginner. We have had 4 pools in 40 years. I was actually looking for more information on the chemicals. Very little on this area. From experience I would recommend an above ground pool with a salt system. We keep ours in doors in a 3 sided building with roof. It stays very clean and water needs less care than outside. Shocking is needed once in a while to eliminate cloudy water. I have begun to run the filter longer to keep the water clear . Stay away from

solar heaters. A waste of money. We have a small spa heater, wired by a specialist, 240 volts. Burns the chill off and allows us to swim earlier in the day and season. Cost is 1--3 dollars a day. Cheaper than a resort hotel and someday when you are tired of it or move you can throw it away! The book could help you make the decision between cement pond and above ground pool. 4bh

We have wanted to buy a pool since we built our house 10 yrs ago and decided this year was the year! But we don't even know anybody with an AGP and I was ordering it from a company out of town so I really wanted an owners manual, this seemed like the thing to go with after reading other reviews. Only thing, as a professional pool person, I sort of wish he had some input from newbies like us. We did our own installation and had a few things come up I wish he had covered in the book. We had one small section of the pool wall near a footing that had a small bend in it once the pool was 3/4 full. We spent 2 weeks leveling so it is COMPLETELY level, we think there may be some suction created when the pool was filling. We filled it up the rest of the way and it got a little better, but it's still there. Also took us 2 weeks to get the chlorine to register, he talks about liquid chlorine in the book but it's hard enough to find any pool supplies, and nobody sells liquid chlorine. If we had access to professional pool chemicals like he did, that might make more sense. I think instead of looking at it in a way where everything goes right, he should have done it from a point of view of what all could possibly go wrong. The section on types of pools helped me decide what to finally purchase and we ended up spending about \$1,000 more than I originally budgeted, but I am glad. You can't pool shop on price or you'll regret it later. We also had trouble finding out how much sand to use in the sand filter. There was a label on the barrel that had all these units of measurement we have never heard of, couldn't even find the answer googling it. I wish he had talked about this in the sand filter section. Just little things that totally clueless people like us might come up against. I am hoping that now that it's up the book will be more helpful about maintenance.

Ultimate guide is a poor title for this book. I bought it as a guide to help understand how to bury pool half way into the ground and build a deck around it. I think the information on how to build a deck for the pool is about a paragraph long even though it states it boldly on the front cover on how to do it. This book does however go into GREAT depth about the history of water and materials of pools if that's something you care about.

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
